

1. When can I register? You can register starting January 1. Start times are assigned in order of receipt of registration and are assigned at 30-second intervals. Mailed registrations must be mailed by February 28. Online registrations will be accepted through midnight on March 18 at www.theorun.com or until we reach **500** teams.
2. May I register the day of the event? Yes, we will be accepting registrations the day of the event.
3. Can I drop off my registration in person? No. Registrations must be mailed no later than February 28, or you can register online by March 18, or on the day of the event.
4. What is a coed team? Coed teams consists of male and female—i.e., two males and two females; one male and three females; or one female and three males.
5. How old do you have to be to run in the O-Run? All team members must be a minimum age of 14 and a minimum of one adult over the age of 18 per team.
6. Do you allow refunds or team member substitutions? This event is a non-refundable event. If a substitution is necessary, just bring your substitute with you on the day of the event with a signed waiver.
7. When can I get my start time? Start times will be posted online starting March 1 and updated WEEKLY at www.theorun.com **Start times are approximate and are subject to change.** You must check-in ONE HOUR prior to your assigned start time. It could take up to 15 minutes to get in the gate and get parked.
8. What time do I need to check-in? All members of a team must check-in at the SAME time and no later than one hour prior to your start time. For example, if your Start Time is at 10 a.m., you must check-in by 9 a.m.
9. What do I need for race day check in? You don't need anything for check-in. Waivers are only needed if you are substituting a team member.
10. What about my CAR KEYS? Where can I put them? We will have a "Key Valet" for participants. Please bring your keys to the tent that says "Key Valet;" and we will keep them while you run!
11. Will there be refreshments? Yes, we will have water stations throughout the course. Also, PowerAde, Water and fresh fruit for run participants after the race.
12. Do we get a T-Shirt? YES! After you complete the event, official T-shirts to mark the day will be given out. If registering on the day of the event, T-Shirts can not be guaranteed.
13. How are teams timed? We use the ChampionChip Timing System to electronically record your team's time. You will be assigned one timing chip for your team at the start of the event. The chip will be attached to one member's ankle and will be collected at the Finish Line. Your team will be charged a \$30 fee if the chip is not returned.
14. Do teams have to stay together? Yes, teams are required to complete obstacles together and all team members MUST cross the finish line.
15. Do all team members have to complete each obstacle? Yes, all team members must complete each obstacle. If they are unable to complete the obstacle, a penalty of one minute will be deducted from the team's time.

16. Do all team members need to sign a Waiver? Yes, upon completion of registration online your team captain signs a waiver for all team members, for mail in registration the team captain signs the waiver for all team members. Click here www.theorun.com/pdfs/waiver.pdf to download the Waiver. O-Run participants under the age of 18 must have a parent sign the Waiver. If the parent will not be present at the event, participants under the age of 18 must have their parent sign the Waiver prior to the event and have it **NOTARIZED**.

17. Are we allowed to bring coolers? No coolers are allowed at the event.

18. Are alcoholic beverages allowed or available? Alcohol is STRICTLY PROHIBITED from this event! It will not be sold and will NOT be allowed at the event.

19. What happens if we were a team of four but someone backs out or is sick the day of the race? You can run with three members, but you get a 10-minute penalty! If you are able to find a replacement, bring the new person with a signed waiver to the event and you are all set!

20. After a teammate has already cleared the wall obstacle, can another teammate go back around and help the other teammates? You are not officially allowed to go back and help BUT if the supervisor of the obstacle observes a team trying and struggling to get the fourth person over, they will sometimes allow you to go back and assist. It is a 1-minute per infraction cited by the race official. And it is up to the obstacle supervisor.
